Georgia Transmission and Amicalola EMC work together to ensure reliable electricity is at the ready for long-time residents and businesses, and those new to the area.

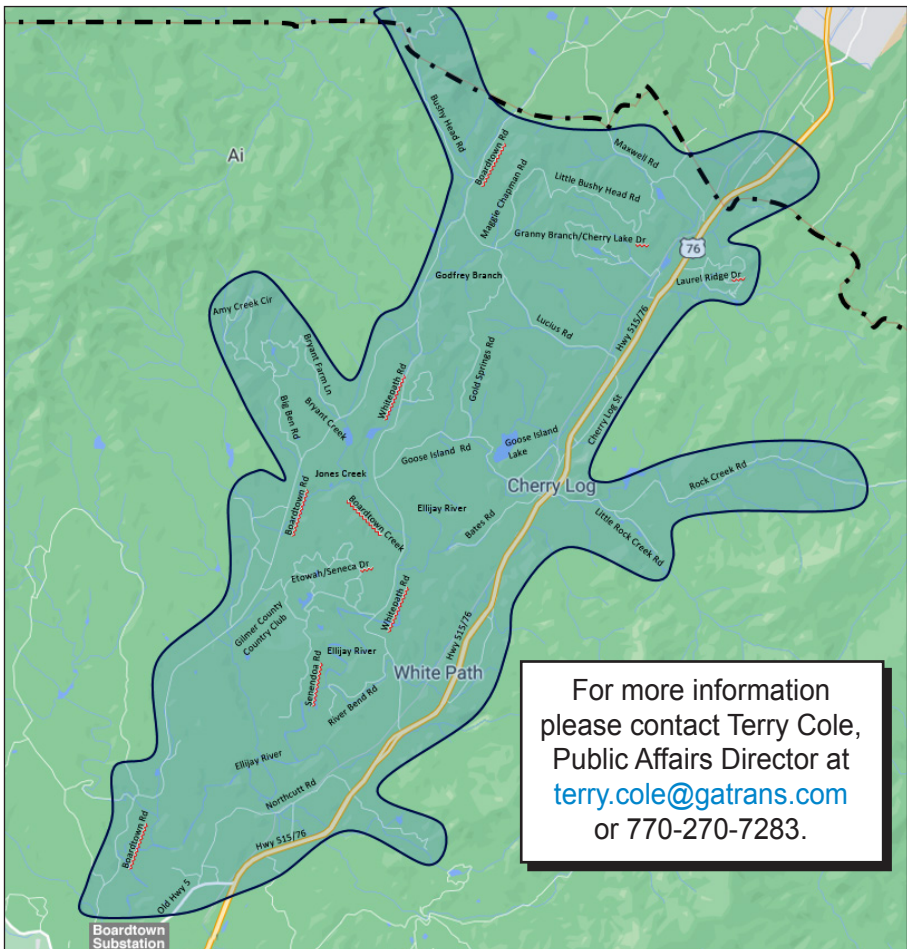
